Herb Rosenthal, KL7AE, has passed along some helpful information from the Personal Communications Foundation on avoiding legal problems amateurs may encounter in erecting antennas and towers. Zoning ordinances in many localities are currently being designed to severely restrict the use of outdoor antennas and towers, or to eliminate them altogether. At this time, there are some subdivisions here in Anchorage where radio towers are prohibited.

If you are looking into buying a new home or erecting an antenna or tower at your present location, you can save yourself a great deal of grief if you first check with your local government for any zoning restrictions in your area. Read the zoning ordinance and be sure you understand the terminology. Check for any permits required (building permit, etc.). Additionally, neighborhood homeowners associations may have their own restrictions in any given area; therefore, deed restrictions should also be carefully checked. If any doubts persist, you may desire to consult an attorney specializing in real estate for advice. Brochures from the Personal Communications Foundation are available on this subject and other items of legal interest to amateurs.

Speaking of upgrading, Wilse Morgan, KL7CQ, will be conducting an Advanced Amateur License class at one of the local high schools this fall. This class is sponsored by UAA and worth 3 credits.
