The enclosed letters were received from the 1992 Masters World Cup race director. A special thanks goes out to KL7GM, AL7MM, AL7JZ, NL7PP, WL7AME, NL7DL, NL7DK, WD0ETG, KL7HHO, KL7HO and KL7IZZ for their help. Esp[ecially Harvey who was such a big help in getting things organized at Kincaid Park.

With as many as 580 skilers on 100 km of race trails at one time the communications management was extremely complex and the amateur radio operations saved the day repeatedly when the other 5 separate communications systems lacked the capability of responding to rapidly changing conditions and needs. It was a lot of hard work but also a lot of fun.

Some new techniques in tally net management were developed that should prove helpful in future race event coverages where there are large numbers of contestants that need to be tracked. What we finally worked out was almost like keeping dupe sheets in a contest.

The amateur radio records were repeatedly used, after the races were over, by race officials to settle disputes since they were the only records that accurately showed which racers passed each check point and the order in which they passed. A lot of race officials and contestants commented on the quality and dependability of the amateur radio operations.

I expect that both the Nordic Ski Club and the City Parks and Recreation Department may be asking for similar help in the future now that they have seen our capabilities.

# **FCC to Revise Amateur Exams**

#### ARNS Bulletin Scoops Others, Brings You the Story First

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Top level FCC officials, who asked not to be named, have leaked plans for radical changes to the written exams for Amateur Radio licenses.

In recognition that hams no longer build their own transmitters and receivers, questions on internal radio equipment circuitry will be eliminated. Arcane electronics questions on Ohm's law, DC and AC circuits, and vacuum tube amplifiers are being deleted.

The new tests will not be shorter, however. Questions relevant to today's technology and operating practices will replace the deleted ones. Tests for all levels will contain more questions on operating practice, for instance.

Novice and General tests will ask when punctuation should be spelled out on CW; how long one should send CQ before listening; and the meanings of Q-signals.

The General class test will have questions on packet communications, personal computer usage, interfacing a PC to radio equipment, and VHF and UHF propagation.

Advanced Class seekers will face questions on HF propagation, antennas, television and telephone interference, and on how to treat neighbors' interference complaints.

Prospective Extras must answer DX-related questions, such as how to tell when a DX station is operating split and whether it's okay to ask for QSL info on the DX station's frequency.

The FCC wants to improve operator efficiency by reducing redundancy and ensuring hams know good operating practices. In the words of an FCC spokesperson, "Fatuous practices like sending 'My QTH is ...' and 'Best 73s' can best be eliminated by testing on the exact meanings of ham abbreviations.

VEs will begin receiving the new tests in August, according to current plans, and must start using them on September 1, 1992. A compendium of sample questions will—under the Freedom of Information Act—be available to anyone. The cost of the book will be announced "shortly," as will its publication date.

Our FCC source summed up this way: "The current administration recognizes Radio Amateurs as a vital national asset and wishes to ensure the continued wellbeing of the service. Advancing technology has brought the positive changes reflected in our new testing program.

"The agency is especially interested in promoting interest in ham radio among the young, as a way of engendering their interest in science. A kinder, gentler FCC cares about hams!"

#### News From The UHF Committee

"AM-SSB vs FM The Difference"
Many operators coming into the FM (Frequency Modulation) side of our hobby are familiar with AM (Amplitude Modulation) type radios and or SSB (Single Side band) type radios. In the case of AM-SSB type radios, the louder you speak into the mike, the more power the radio will put out, as audio drive is directly related to the power output, (up to a limit).

In FM this is not true. Most all communications type FM radios are internally hard limited to 4.5 to 5.0 kilohertz in their deviation, any attempt to go over this built-in limiting, results in severe deviation in the output audio! So talking louder into the mike of your FM handheld, or mobile, does NOT make you a more powerfull signal, it actually acts against you, because your audio (voice) becomes so distorted that you are not understood by other users, or are unable to get into your favorite repeater.

For those of you tempted to pop the case and turn up your deviation limiter, (your warranty has expired when the case is opened)! Remember that all FM gear in use today follows the narrow-band commercial guidelines, and in many cases is commercial equipment modified for Amateur service. Commercial standards call for, on the transmitter side an absolute MAXIMUM OF 5 Kilohertz in overall deviation, this is your voice PLUS any sub-tone you might be running. On the receiver side, all receivers meeting commercial narrow-band FM standards have an absolute bandwidth of 7.5 Kilohertz. However, all receivers will begin to squelch off an over deviated signal at the 5.5 Kilohertz point.

What all this means is DON'T yell into your handheld or mobile mike, it doesn't make you louder or stronger than the next person, it just makes you much more distorted and maybe not able to get into your friend's receiver, or repeater. And remind those that you call on a autopatch, that there is no need to yell into their telephone either.
