ARLB007 FCC Seeks Public Comments on Emergency Communications by Amateur Radio and Impediments to Amateur Radio Communications.

In response to the Congressional directive to prepare a study to assess Amateur Radio's role in emergency and disaster communications and the impact of private land use regulations on the amateur community's ability to provide such communications, the FCC issued DA 12-523 soliciting comments from the public. The period for public comment runs until May 17, 2012.

"As part of the study contained in Public Law No. 112-96, the Commission has opened a 45 day period for comments to be filed on the issue," said ARRL Regulatory Information Manager Dan Henderson, N1ND. "Because of the short deadline for the study to be completed and presented to Congress -- before the end of August -- the ARRL and the amateur community must quickly mobilize their response."

The FCC Public Notice focuses on two specific areas for comments. The first is the role that Amateur Radio has played and continues to play to support emergency and disaster relief organizations, such as FEMA and local/state emergency management agencies. The second is to determine impediments to enhanced Amateur Radio communications. This would include the impact that private land-use regulations –

such as deed restrictions and homeowner association covenants -- have on the ability of licensed amateurs to fully participate in providing support communications to the served agencies.

"This study is not about zoning ordinances or regulations adopted by the local or state governments," Henderson explained. "Amateurs already have the limited protection of PRB-1 to assist them with those situations. The areas of concern here are the limitations that are placed on a property when it is purchased, either as part of the deed of sale or by restrictions imposed by the neighborhood/homeowner's association. Those restrictions -- sometimes referred to as CC&Rs -- are not currently covered by the FCC's PRB-1 decision from 1985."

To allow the ARRL to quickly collect and collate relevant information from the amateur community to help support the filing it will make with the FCC on this issue, a website has been setup. The site -- www.arrl.org/ccr-study-information -- provides details about what kind of information is needed by the ARRL.

Also on the site, you will find links to two online data collection forms. The first form allows you to provide information about specific emergency communications in which Amateur Radio has played a role since January 2000. The second form asks for specific information on the CC&Rs/deed restrictions that control your property. It also asks you to provide information on how those restrictions have impacted your ability to fully support emergency communications.

"Whether you are an ARRL member or not, your information and situation are important to helping us make the case for all amateurs," Henderson said. "Whether your support communications are with ARES, RACES, SKYWARN, CERT or other emergency and disaster groups, your voice should be heard. If you cannot operate effectively from home during an emergency because CC&Rs prohibit adequate antennas on your property, that is important to document and quantify. This issue affects all of Amateur Radio, not just ARRL members."

Henderson said that due to the short timeframe that the FCC has allotted for public comment, time is of the essence. In order to allow the ARRL to develop its comments, the ARRL asks that all information sent by the amateur community be received at the ARRL no later than April 25, 2012: "We realize this is a very short turnaround asking for your response, but this is based on the time provided by the Commission for the comment window."

It is important that when you provide specifics of your CC&R, you also provide the ARRL with a copy of its actual wording. If you have the CC&R in a digital format (or you can scan the document into a file), it can either be uploaded through the website above or it can be sent via an e-mail to <a href="mailto:CCRinfo@arrl.org">CCRinfo@arrl.org</a>. If you do not have an elec-

tronic format, a hard copy may be sent via US mail to: CCR Study Information, ARRL, 225 Main St, Newington, CT 06111.

"We need factual, specific details," Henderson said. "The more accurate information we have -- including copies of the CC&R language -- the stronger case we can make. Having copies of the exact CC&Rs is important. It allows us to demonstrate the wide variation of restrictions. Including the specific text is as important as any other piece of information you provide."

"Again, time is of the essence in this matter," Henderson said. "This is the best opportunity that amateurs have had to address the impact of overly burdensome private land use restrictions. If Amateur Radio is to succeed in this effort, it is going to take all of us working together."

The Board Meeting was called to order by President Randy Vallee, KL7Z at 7:02pm. A quorum was established.

Additions to the Agenda – Field Day – TJ Sheffield, KL7TS, Executive Session; not to be recorded, Club House Renters Insurance, KL7KO; this will be covered under finance. Therefore we did not add this item on the agenda. Mike Romanello, KL7BK – Michael O'Keefe, KL7MD needs to cover equipment to be donated and what to do with it.

Deletions to the Agenda – None

#### Reports:

**Secretary** - Kathleen O'Keefe, KL7KO – Several corrections to Board Meeting from January 2012. Extensive changes were made. Both minutes were accepted as presented with corrections noted. There was a correction to the General Minutes as well. Tom Rutigliano, NL7TZ made the motion to accept both sets of minutes as corrected for the Board. Lara Baker, AL2R seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer – Ken Perry, AL7GA – The Reports were covered by Keith Clark, KL7MM. Not really anything new to report. Do have some items to discuss with Ken Perry, AL7GA. If there are any questions please let me know so I can ask him. TJ Sheffield, KL7TS had questions about discrepancies between reports. Any questions will be brought up at the Finance Meeting. TJ Sheffield showed items in question on the overhead. There was a recommendation to fund the ECCP Fund. Some discussion followed. This and other topics will be covered by the Finance Committee. Questions came from TJ Sheffield, KL7TS, Kathleen O'Keefe, KL7KO, and Jim Larsen, AL7FS. Mention was made to the past and future expenditures with loss of finances due to misappropriation of past funds. Again this would be covered during the Finance Committee meeting. Randy Vallee, KL7Z recommended further discussion needs to be covered by the Finance Committee.

Broke for Executive Session.

Mike Romanello, KL7BK – Michael O'Keefe, KL7MD. Mike Romanello, KL7BK was given a dStar system from Icom sent him \$3,000.00 of equipment that the Slope will not allow him to set up. The club would need to provide a computer, antenna and cans. Mike then asked the board members if the club has cans and computers. Jim Wiley, KL7CC stated no, but Rich Gillin, AL4S said yes. Randy Vallee, KL7Z moved this item to the Project Committee.

Lara Baker, AL2R, made a motion that the record show that the Board has complete confidence in Randy Vallee, KL7Z, and Keith Clark, KL7MM, in their actions and interactions with our attorneys and that Randy Vallee, KL7Z, and Keith Clark, KL7MM be instructed to continue their interactions with the attorneys and are to be hereby instructed to continue these interactions and to make decisions on behalf of the Board. Randy Valley, KL7Z, and Keith Clark, KL7MM are also hereby instructed to report to the Board when they think it appropriate or when a decision by the board is needed. The motion was seconded by Jim Wiley, KL7CC. No further discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

**VEC Program** – Jim Wiley, KL7CC – The 60 meter rule changes are in the horizon. Information was given regarding how to submit comments. Bill Cross covered with Jim Wiley, KL7CC, remote testing and license renewal. The NPRN was covered.

The Daily Digest through the FCC details every item the FCC covers in a given day and Amateur Radio is but one small area they work on daily.

All items are moving forward. There is a need for new test books for the VEC and these will be emailed to Great Originals for printing. Jim Wiley, KL7CC will distribute the kits.

**Trustee** – Keith Clark, KL7MM – There are no requests for use of the club call sign pending. The Club house is being used.

**Membership** – Fred Erickson, KL7FE – Since he was not at the meeting, no report or update was given.

**Projects Committee** – TJ Sheffield, KL7TS – Again Finance Committee information was covered prior to moving forward. Funds donated over the last thirteen years were shown and how much the club has donated over the years was shown on the overhead. Baseline budget was again shown with adjustments made for travel and other items. There are no discretionary funds covered. The Finance Committee tries to help forecast the expenses that will be reviewed every quarter. Add to the forecast all events and travel. Then we work against last years expenses. Add projects then. Pactor 4 was ordered, shipped ordered and installed. One project carried over was the Satellite Project Phase II. The club is still \$10,000.00 short of what we need to spend from the Gaming Income. An additional review of accounts was shown on the overhead. The next decision is how to spend these funds. Lara Baker, AL2R, pointed out we have funds left yet to spend. TJ Sheffield, KL7TS has Three Projects to bring up for funding. Jim Larsen, AL7FS asked if donations are shown on the report.

Project One – Wire. The club always has a use for wire. Need more wire for ground radial kits. A request for the amount of Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900.00) to be spent for a variety of wire to cover Field Day and additional equipment needs. Lara Baker, AL2R, Jim Larsen, AL7FS, and Randy Vallee, KL7Z, had additional questions and information that came out in discussion. Michael O'Keefe, KL7MD, reminded the board that our gaming income is probably not going to grow back to what is was in the past.

Project Two – Aluminum Tower. This tower is to be used at Field Day. Total cost for this project would be in the amount of Thirteen Hundred Dollars (\$1,300.00). Additional in-depth information was provided by TJ Sheffield, KL7TS. Jim Larsen, AL7FS, asked if this can be shown as an Emergency ARES application as opposed to just being used during Field Day.

Project Three – 10 band vertical Mark I. The Mark I has issues and there is a need to replace this item with a Mark IV. This item has been taken apart once before and it is believed an individual contesting had the power too high. The proposal is to sell the current system and purchase the newer system. The total proposed cost for this project is Two Thousand Two Hundred Dollars, (\$2,200.00). This would include lightening protection. In-depth information is given as to why this needs to be approved by TJ Sheffield, KL7TS. Lara Baker, AL2R, asked what the cost would be to repair the

Mark I. This is unknown as TJ Sheffield; KL7TS, feels that the company no longer works on the Mark I.

Discussion regarding all three project proposals followed. Michael O'Keefe, KL7MD had questions. Jim Larsen, AL7FS had questions. Lara Baker, AL2R had questions.

These projects were tracked by the Board and one nomination was made by Lara Baker, AL2R, to approve Project One and Two not to exceed the amount of Two Thousand Two Hundred Dollars. Lara Baker, AL2R, made the addition to the motion that Project Three needs further research and to see if the system can be repaired. Jim Larsen, AL7FS seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Project Numbers for Project 1 is 2012-002 and Project 2 is 2012-003.

Finance Committee – Keith Clark, KL7MM –Keith Clark, KL7MM discussed the agenda items covered during the Finance Committee meeting. Item two was credit card discussion. This information was reported to the Board. The Board needs to determine if the debit card should be changed to three credit cards and controls and limits set in place by the Board. Discussion followed. Jim Wiley, KL7CC had questions. Jim Larsen, AL7FS had input regarding credit cards. Lara Baker, AL2R had additional input. Keith Clark, KL7MM covered other items outlined in the Finance Committee Report. Keith Clark, KL7MM, and Ken Perry, AL7GA, need to do attritional research with the banks and financial institutions that currently hold the special accounts. During additional discussion information was provided requesting the Board approve a donation from the non-gaming funds in the amount of \$25.00 to the QTH Reflector. Lara Baker, AL2R, made that motion. It was seconded by Jim Larsen, AL7FS. Keith Clark, KL7MM discussed Renter's Insurance and how to go about getting it. Michael O'Keefe, KL7MD, reported we need a base line in what the values are of the assets in the club house. Without this information it is not possible to quote Renter's Insurance. Kathleen O'Keefe, KL7KO further reinforced that without this information we can move no further. Paul Spatzek, WL7BF, will provide this information. Tom Rutigliano, KL7TS, suggested the club check with ARRL to see if we are eligible for insurance with them. Keith Clark, KL7MM, then covered the amount of equipment is currently valued at \$24,000.00 Michael O'Keefe, KL7MD, further discussed the need for Board Insurance, Vehicle insurance, and that the vehicles are not covered unless being operated. Randy Vallee, KL7Z, moved this back to the Finance Committee. Randy Valley, KL7Z asked Keith Clark, KL7MM if Richard Block, KL7RLB wishes to continue with the Finance Committee. 

Keith Clark said the Board should send flowers up to a \$50.00 value. No one was opposed and a motion was not made. The final approval would be worked out with Randy Vallee.

**Projects Committee** – TJ Sheffield, KL7TS – The overhead was used to show how income and expenses are shown. TJ Sheffield again showed the Finance Committee projections of funds received and where it has currently been spent in the forecast. This shows the baseline budget. We show an increase to the attorney fees and events. Only Field Day has been authorized. Event Managers need to get their forecast to the Finance Committee so it can be budgeted. We are currently showing we still have \$17.000.00 under the state requirement of what we need to spend. The blue line is the actual amount spent. Anything above the line is in the bank.

Eleven years ago it was proposed to combine Life Member and Building Funds together. This has not been done yet.

**Finance Committee** – Keith Clark, KL7MM – We had a committee meeting and discussed 2011 Gaming income of \$83,286.00. However we received information they may be sending another \$9,000 or so. Without the final figures we don't have official closing numbers. Discussed the credit card and Smith Barney and what is being done with them; so far nothing yet. No glaring items came up with the review of the budget. However, we need to keep an eye on a couple items. Jim Larsen, AL7FS, wants to understand why we pay so much money having door prizes every month. Also, why is the phone bill every month so expensive? TJ Sheffield, KL7TS, said it is because we have three phone lines coming in and two of the lines are for control numbers for Glenn Alps. Rich Gillin, AL4S, also said we have an upgraded voice mail that also increases the cost. Additional questions came from the Board. Jim Wiley, KL7CC, gave additional information regarding how the voice mail as to how things were handled in the past.

Keith Clark, KL7MM, stated as far as door prizes this cost has been cut and only goes for ten months. Jim Larsen, AL7FS, feels this is still too much to pay people to come to meetings. TJ Sheffield, KL7TS, pointed out the door prizes are designed more towards Emergency Services items. Tom Ireland, KL3IJ, supported Keith Clark's, KL7MM, statement.

Keith Clark, KL7MM, has been looking into other buildings for the club to consider leasing. The FCC building has been looked at as well as some of the buildings on Kulis ANG as possibilities of moving to other buildings. As of yet no facilities are available for leasing from the State of Alaska who will be managing the facility where Kulis ANG originally was housed. This research is being done because the current location is so noisy.

Jim Larsen, AL7FS, feels the club should review what equipment we need to have for future responses. A plan should be set in place and reviewed.

Additional information followed with a question and answer session. Jim Wiley, KL7CC, had additional comments and suggestions. Rich Gillin, AL4S, also had comments and suggestions. Keith Clark, KL7MM also had comments and suggestions.

"Alaska ARES and the Alaska Native Medical Center have in joint effort stood up a HF Remote Messaging System (HF RMS) in Anchorage. This system provides HF Radio Email Service to the area. In an emergency this system will provide digital email capabilities if we lose the Internet. It is designed to accept connections from Amateur Operators who are using either PacLink or Airmail software and a Pactor 1-3 capable Terminal Mode Controller (TNC). If the Internet is lost to the area the RMS will forward messages to another RMS over HF Radio. Being HF Radio based, the coverage area is quite large. While it is intended for intra-Alaska use we have stations from as far away as Arizona using the HF RMS to pass email traffic to the internet on occasions.

ARES also hosts a VHF RMS which provides Radio to Email service on VHF Radio in the Anchorage area.
